Doing research and operating and maintaining a research infrastructure in a high alpine environment has always been and will remain a challenging experience. I am extremely happy to notice that in 2014, as in previous years, the International Foundation High Altitude Research Stations Jungfraujoch and Gornergrat HFSJG, its management and administration, and the many science teams met these challenges successfully.
